As you know by now, Keith Gillenwater, our president and CEO of nine years announced his resignation late in 2023. While this may have been a cause for great concern for some organizations, we were blessed to have Tenille Zartman on staff for the past seven years. Tenille has been preparing for this role as president and CEO for years.

Our search committee and board were very happy to welcome Tenille into the role in early 2024. She has hit the ground running and is moving forward with the initiatives and projects already in place. We are grateful to Tenille for her interest, passion and leadership!

In 2023 we focused on continuing the work being done on various projects in place and looking for new initiatives to help Wabash County grow and prosper. Some of the major accomplishments include:

- The expansion of Ford Meter Box
- Leveraging over \$200,000 in scholarships for 101 Wabash County residents to pursue certifications
- Continuing our strategies to attract and support new businesses both domestic and abroad
- New support and resources for entrepreneurs of all ages

Wabash County continued to see progress on various housing projects in 2023. Site/infrastructure preparation work for Legacy Heights (previous Wabash County Hospital site) can be seen in action. Kentner Creek saw the first two homes built in 2023! The Grow Wabash County staff also continue to work on plans for the East Market Street Development.

Grow Wabash County, alongside the Community Foundation of Wabash County, continues to carry the torch for the ImagineOne 85 (IO85) initiative. They have found a strong leader, Alex Downard, who does the day to day work of engaging with a variety of partners throughout the county, including North Manchester, Lagro, LaFontaine, Roann, the City of Wabash and Wabash County at large.

Some of the ImagineOne 85 initiatives that saw encouraging process in 2023 include the development of the Wabash County Fellowship Program, which will support local businesses with personnel needs and bring students into Wabash County for the summer.

ImagineOne 85 has also launched a Small Scale Developer Program, educating and supporting anyone interested in community and business development.

The Grow Wabash County team also saw several staff changes in 2023. Tenille Zartman and Chelsea Parson remain with the organization, and Grow Wabash County had the pleasure of welcoming Amber White and Jana Thibos into the fold, both of them bringing with them their unique talents and passion for the work being done by the organization. Grow Wabash County has also hosted an impressive slate of student interns from local high schools and Manchester University. We are grateful for their passion, dedication and ongoing work!

This is just a small glimpse of the great work done by Grow Wabash County and our local communities in 2023, but these small glimpses are indicative of the grander visions Grow Wabash County has for itself as well as for the future of Wabash County. These visions will propel us through 2024 and beyond!



BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT



Business Development in Wabash County hit **new highs** in 2023! Through our persistence and expertise, Grow Wabash County carried out its SMART goals through our Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) plan. This work and the GWC organization were both instrumental in the securing of many projects and millions of dollars worth in investment for the community.

Business development success in 2023 included the **attraction of new businesses** from outside county lines as well as persuading local companies ready to expand that the best place to do so was right here in Wabash County, **keeping it local and growing where they've already set down roots**. Many of these projects got their start in 2023, but will certainly carry into **2024**, **2025 and beyond**, bringing with them the prospects of **new jobs**, **new investment** and a **stronger business environment** for Wabash County.

FORD METER BOX

The **Ford Meter Box Company, Inc.**, a manufacturer of underground waterworks products headquartered in Wabash, Indiana, announced in 2023 its plans to construct a **300,000 SF** state-of-the-art nonferrous foundry on a **90- acre** site in Wabash's northeast industrial park.

The announced multi-year modernization effort represents a **\$250-300 million** investment in technology, capacity, flexibility, safety, automation, and training across two Wabash campuses.

The project is intended to increase the company's resilience for the long term while addressing waterworks needs arising from an aging U.S. water infrastructure and the construction of single and multi-family housing units.

Projects like this further demonstrate the importance of building strong relationships between the community and the businesses that call Wabash County home. The work done by Grow Wabash County, the City of Wabash, and various other partners were a key aspect of the decision made by Ford Meter Box to ultimately choose to keep their expansion in Wabash County.

Grow Wabash County had the privilege of celebrating the start of this new project with a ground-breaking ceremony in the fall of 2024.

Since its groundbreaking, the Ford Meter Box project has earned recognition from two different industry publications: "**Deal of the Year**" from **Business Facilities** magazine and "**Top Project**" as part of the State of Indiana's **Silver Shovel Award** from **Area Development** magazine.



ENTREPRENEURSHIP





Grow Wabash County is dedicated to providing support for small businesses and entrepreneurs in our community. Through our array of programs and services, we offer a **nurturing environment** for business growth and development.

We facilitate access to funding and financing resources through our own **Revolving Loan Fund**, or the newly launched **Micro Loan Program**, and by connecting entrepreneurs with our great partner lenders to fuel their ventures.

Additionally, we offer **leadership programs** and free education events to hone the skills of emerging business leaders.

Our support extends to **marketing assistance**, providing guidance on **branding strategies** to enhance visibility and reach. Entrepreneurs can benefit from access to **shared office spaces and facilities**, including conference rooms for meetings and collaborations.

We celebrate milestones with events such as **groundbreakings**, **ribbon cuttings**, and **key ceremonies**, recognizing the achievements of our local businesses.

Furthermore, we offer **regulatory and compliance guidance**, assisting businesses in navigating **legal requirements** effectively. Moreover, we **facilitate connections** to local supply chains, vendors, and business service professionals, **fostering collaboration and growth** within our community.

Additionally, we provide support for **Riverfront District Alcohol Permits** in Wabash, streamlining the permitting process for businesses in the area.

Through these initiatives, Grow Wabash County is committed to **empowering** entrepreneurs and small businesses, driving economic prosperity and innovation in our region.

ENTREPRENEUR COACHING


To boost our abilities to better serve our thriving entrepreneurial community, Grow Wabash County has engaged with multiple partners to host not one, but two, entrepreneurship coaches in the GWC office: **Angela Harrison** and **Wes Shie**.

Angela began holding weekly office hours in the Grow Wabash County office to meet with local entrepreneurs in person or virtually. She has an extensive background in the world of business and entrepreneurship, especially in the areas of **retail management** and **community development**.

Her experience in education also shines through as she works in her current role as a coach for the **Northeast Indiana Innovation Center** (NIIC), where she mentors entrepreneurs and business owners at all stages in their business journey to start and maintain their businesses.

Wes has also began meeting with clients in Grow Wabash County. He joined the **Northeast Indiana Small Business Development Center** (SBDC) staff as a business advisor in 2010 and has served as the Regional Director since 2014.

He came to the SBDC with years of experience in **banking** and f**inancial services** from previously working as a relationship manager for Wells Fargo and Chase Bank. Prior to working in commercial banking, Wes also served as a **finance specialist** for the Community Development Corporation (CDC) of Fort Wayne.



Quality of life in Wabash County is on the forefront of our minds here at Grow Wabash County as well as the minds of the organizations and individuals who work every day to make our communities **the best they can be**. All of our work to be a welcoming community, whether that be through increased engagement with the **Young Professionals of Wabash County**, the creation of programs to celebrate the very best of our **local arts, culture and recreation**, or through the construction of **new houses** to call home, sweet home, is paying off. Every day, people are seeking out Wabash County and trying to find out how they can **build the life** they've always imagined right here in our community.

IMAGINE ONE 85

It has been over **two years** since Wabash County came together to adopt the **Imagine One 85 comprehensive plan**, pledging to all operate under the same strategic plan to grow our population and secure Wabash County's future.

In 2023, Wabash County enjoyed many wins that directly connected back to the 85 priorities outlined in the comprehensive plan.

In **Roann**, their vision to add a park, baseball diamond and even a splash pad began to take shape and fundraising efforts picked up momentum. **Lagro** continued its efforts to revitalize their downtown area, and **LaFontaine** is setting their sites on becoming an official Main Street Organization.

North Manchester was able to officially open their pavilion on Ogan's Landing, hosting various events and performances throughout the spring and summer. The arrival of a community dog park has also welcomed more visitors with their four-legged friends!

Wabash County has also welcomed several new businesses to their communities featuring new products, vendors and job opportunities.




Countywide, we witnessed the progress of five different housing developments, directly addressing the challenge we have so often faced when attracting new people to our community: where will they live?

Over **\$2M** was awarded to the **Legacy Heights** project by READI 1.0, lots started to sell quickly at **Kentner Creek**, and a new residential TIF district was established in North Manchester to help move their newest project forward.

Alex Downard, acting director of Imagine One 85, was also instrumental in the recruitment of ambassadors, called Community Champions, to help spread the word about why Wabash County is the place to be. With the support of various organizations like the Community Foundation of Wabash County, Visit Wabash County and MakeMyMove, these champions have played a key role in spotlighting the hospitality and human connections a life in Wabash County can offer.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT



In 2023, Grow Wabash County continued its work to further cultivate a **skilled labor force** to help meet the **current and future workforce needs** in our major industries. Thanks to the continued support from the **Community Foundation of Wabash County**, as well as funds from **Next Level Jobs**, the **Ivy Tech Foundation**, **WorkOne (H1B)**, **Freedom Academy** and local employers we helped dozens of Wabash County citizens take a strong step forward in their professional journeys.

In 2023, Grow Wabash County helped bring the following classes to Wabash County: Certified Clinical Medical Assistant; CNC Machining ; Commercial Drivers License; Emergency Medical Technician; Frontline Leadership; Industrial Maintenance; Lean Six Sigma Black Belt; Leadership Development Wabash County; Townsend Leadership Program; and Welding.

A PLACE FOR LEARNING

The vision of a centralized hub for adult education has been a priority for Grow Wabash County and its many educational partners well before 2023, but 2023 became the year where that vision became even clearer, more concrete. It even secured a tentative address in Wabash County.

After several return trips to the drawing board for the various aspects of establishing an adult education center in Wabash County, large strides forward were made to put those plans into action.


In 2023, Grow Wabash County stepped into a more supportive role to help **Learn More Center** in its new role as the lead organization for this project. This support included connecting and convening the educational providers interested in holding offices in the future facility **(Freedom Academy, WorkOne, etc.)**

This support also took the form of building relationships between Learn More Center and the many donors and investors who have pledged their financial support for this project since 2020.

Of course, once a new space was brought under consideration for the education center, the conversation also shifted to strategies to fill the gap in funding to actually purchase and renovate the space. Work is now being done to construct and create the physical representation of all the work and imagining and persevering that Wabash County has done as a community to provide more opportunities for post-secondary education and lifelong learning.

There is still much to be done to finalize the details and agreements and ephemera that goes into developing such an ambitious project, but the progress made in 2023 has provided us at Grow Wabash County and our many partners with a **rejuvenated energy** to bring this long awaited dream to life and to start making an even greater impact on our **local talent development and attraction efforts**.
