In 2025, business development remained a key strategic focus, with efforts centered on supporting growth among new, expanding, and reinvesting employers and advancing redevelopment opportunities that are critical to long-term economic vitality.

The county celebrated multiple grand openings, including Nest Coffee, Towne Market, Winco Plastics, ARC of Wabash County's Kaleidoscope Art Studio, Copper Tooth Bar & Bistro, Springfield Plastics, Physical Choice Therapy, and many more.

Several significant projects broke ground or advanced through development, including Kendall Electric's new regional headquarters, Plumb Square LLC, a 30,000 SF speculative building with Logan Properties, and a new Bowen Health facility. At the same time, existing businesses such as Braspy's Trinkets & Vault Family Center, Custom Cartons, and Intertech Products announced expansions and new product lines.

In 2025, Grow Wabash County reaffirmed its commitment to fostering a vibrant and resilient entrepreneurial ecosystem. We supported entrepreneurs by providing education, permitting assistance, site selection guidance, incentive support, business-to-business connections, community outreach, mentor connections, and milestone celebrations as they launched, grew, and strengthened businesses that fuel the local economy.

One of our flagship initiatives, Square One Developers, continued to inspire the next generation of innovators. This program introduced high school students to business and entrepreneurship by connecting them monthly with local entrepreneurs and business leaders over lunch. Square One Developers gave young adults early exposure to real-world experiences and insights, helping them develop an entrepreneurial mindset and embrace creativity, leadership, and innovation.

Grow Wabash County also delivered direct, hands-on guidance to aspiring and existing business owners—both independently and through strategic partnerships from the Northeast Indiana Innovation Center (NIIC) and the Indiana Small Business Development Center (ISBDC).

Through early exposure to business concepts, personalized coaching, and access to support resources, Grow Wabash County continued to nurture and expand the local entrepreneurial landscape in 2025. This ensures that Wabash County remains a thriving hub for creativity, opportunity, and business success.

Grow Wabash County made strong progress in 2025 by advancing multiple on-the-ground livability projects, with a clear focus on housing and education. In partnership with the City of Wabash, GWC moved the East Market Street revitalization effort from vision to action by acquiring all 9 homes on the block and clearing the site for 8–12 new single-family homes, an important step in strengthening neighborhood vitality. Housing momentum continued with active development underway at Kentner Creek Crossing in Wabash and Chester Heights in North Manchester.

That momentum continued countywide as Wabash County began implementing Stellar Pathways projects following its designation as a Stellar Pathways Community, with support from Grow Wabash County. The designation unlocked state funding to advance housing, public spaces, and community amenities, translating collaboration into visible progress. At GWC’s State of Our Communities event, leaders highlighted Stellar investments already underway, including housing-related projects and amenities in North Manchester, as well as implementation efforts through the Level Up Lagro initiative. Together, these efforts have improved the quality of life and strengthened Wabash County’s livability, attractiveness, and long-term growth.

MAKING HOUSING HEADWAY



In 2025, it was announced that \$3 million in funds from the Lilly Endowment’s Blight Remediation program would be awarded to support housing developments in the City of Wabash.

More specifically, the funds were intended to support the construction of over 100 market-rate apartments along the Wabash River trail and 12 to 16 townhouses along East Market Street in downtown Wabash.

In 2025, Grow Wabash County strengthened local talent pipelines through major workforce initiatives, including the launch of the new Adult Education Center. Additionally, thanks to support from the Community Foundation of Wabash County and the Don Wood Foundation, Grow Wabash County leveraged over \$200,000 to help remove financial barriers for Wabash County residents seeking training. The trainings hosted in 2025 include: Commercial Drivers License (CDL); Certified Clinical Medical Assistant; Emergency Medical Technician (EMT); Industrial Maintenance Technician (IMT); and welding.

Grow Wabash County also supported youth workforce development through Wabash High School's pilot P-CAP program, backed by an \$805,000 Don Wood Foundation grant. The initiative provides students with project-based learning opportunities and prepares them for high-skill, high-wage careers.

Adult Education Center opens doors for lifelong learning



Grow Wabash County and Learn More Center were thrilled to celebrate the official opening of Wabash County's new adult education center in 2025.

This new facility boasts flexible classroom space, as well as a health care lab and two advanced manufacturing labs, aligning with the most pressing training needs of major employers in the community.

The space will host classes facilitated by Learn More Center, Freedom Academy and other educational partners, including Ivy Tech Community College and Purdue MEP.

Thanks to a generous donor, the center will officially be named the Pauline Barker Campus. It will serve as a place for training and classes of all kinds, encouraging everyone in Wabash County to keep learning new things!

Amidst the daily work at Grow Wabash County, we never lose sight of how vital our investor **members** are to the **future** of our organization and the many transformative projects we pursue. In 2025, Grow Wabash County continued to benefit from generous grant funding that strengthened our economic development, workforce, and marketing efforts. The support we received this year helped us move closer to Accredited Economic Development Organization (AEDO) status, expand workforce scholarship opportunities, and strengthen our business development, retention, and marketing initiatives.

This year also marked a major milestone as Wabash County was named a 2024 Stellar Pathways designee. This statewide initiative provides multi-year, multi-agency resources to support regional planning and transformative improvements to the quality of place. This designation makes Wabash County eligible for up to \$7 million in funding to implement a wide range of community projects designed to enhance livability and long-term growth.
