A Letter from 2019 Grow Wabash County Board Chair Jason A. Callahan

As the outgoing chair of the Grow Wabash County Board of Directors, I am extremely proud of the work accomplished in 2019 as we work *Together, Growing a Prosperous Wabash County.*

To achieve this mission, Wabash County has made population growth a central focus. Our foundational pillars--workforce development, investor services, entrepreneurship, business development and livability--are built to serve this end. I believe Grow Wabash County

came a long way in achieving its mission in 2019.

Under entrepreneurship, Grow Wabash County created a comprehensive entrepreneurship pipeline, beginning with a countywide entrepreneurship competition for high school students. This program led to 7 out of 10 high school teams which qualified for the Northeast region coming from Wabash County.

Under livability, Grow Wabash County has partnered with the City of Wabash to begin several housing projects to address this need.

In supporting workforce development, Grow Wabash County has supported the efforts of Heartland Career Center to pursue a building expansion through a \$5 million federal grant that would expand Heartland programming to include adult education and training programs.

Under the pillar of business development, Grow Wabash County has continued to work on efforts to build economic development relationships internationally through connections both in Japan and in China.

Finally, under investor services, Grow Wabash County has and will continue to listen to the needs and missions of our local businesses. As our mission statement articulates, we can only achieve success by working *Together*. In order to achieve this and our other goals, Grow Wabash County undertook a successful \$1 million campaign. I want to end my tenure as board chair thanking all of our investors and community champions who help support our efforts.

Entrepreneurship

Armed with the knowledge that the majority of job growth comes from small businesses, one of our primary objectives is to support and cultivate an environment of creation, innovation, and entrepreneurship. We partner with local institutes and regional partners to help bring resources to our existing and startup small businesses.

Indiana Economic Development Corporation Entrepreneurship Grant Awarded

Thanks to a \$195,032 entrepreneurship grant awarded by the Indiana Economic Development Corporation (IEDC), Grow Wabash County was able to better leverage its existing assets to support small businesses and entrepreneurs in 2019.

With the grant funding, we were able to underwrite programs like the *Co.Starters for Causes* entrepreneurship class, INnovate Wabash County high school business pitch competition, and support programming at Messer's Lab, the free 24/7 co-working space located at INGUARD.

Grant funds were also used to implement primary and secondary entrepreneurship education curriculum at Wabash City Schools through the INCubatoredu by Uncharted Learning program. Funds were also used to purchase a new prototyping 3-D printer located in the Innovate @ INGUARD coworking space, fund 12 Business-in-a-Box starter kits, and seed our new INnovate Wabash County high school pitch competition held on April 16, 2019.

Small Business Development Consulting

The Grow Wabash County team acts as a connector for entrepreneurs and business support resources that can help them further grow their enterprise. We work to bring regional and state resources like the Small Business Development Center and SCORE to Wabash County for our local entrepreneurs to utilize. In 2019, we scheduled 33 individuals looking to start or expand their business with Scot Goskowicz, a free business consultant from the Small Business Development Center at our office. Scot offered his expertise free of charge every third Thursday. This partnership will continue in 2020 as we work with the ISBDC to provide free business counseling and other resources to local business owners and entrepreneurs.

Small Business Loans

Grow Wabash County's Revolving Loan Fund Program is aimed at current or prospective business owners located in Wabash County that may need gap funding to help small businesses succeed. Grow Wabash County's goal with this program is to be a financing partner, together with the small businesses' equity and a conventional (primary) lending institution.

At the close of 2019, GWC had two active revolving loans outstanding. The two lenders include KenapocoMocha Coffee & Pastry Shop and the Wabash County Historical Museum. Both of these loans were current and performing according to established guidelines. The loans totaled \$223,315 in outstanding direct loans with \$95,462.22 available for lending on new loans as part of the revolving loan fund program.

Messer's Lab at INGUARD

Messer's Lab at INGUARD is the main hub for our entrepreneurship support programs in Wabash County. This free co-working space hosted a number of events throughout 2019, from business and non-profit groups who utilized the unique space for strategic planning to co-workers who met to foster creative collisions with other entrepreneurs. We were proud to also utilize the first Innovation grant from the Indiana Economic Development Corporation to install a 3D printer there that is free to use.

Co. Starters for Causes Entrepreneurship Course for Nonprofits

Grow Wabash County graduated nine non-profit leaders from *Co.Starters for Causes*, an entrepreneurship course for nonprofits in 2019. Participants dedicated 27 classroom hours over a nineweek period to learn about business concepts and best practices.

Volunteer facilitators that lead participants through the course included: Keith Gillenwater, Grow Wabash County; Julie Garber, Community Foundation of Wabash County; Amanda Lopez, Transform Consulting; and Alan Tio, Kosciusko Economic Development Corporation.

Graduates from this program included: Cheryl Working, Daniel's Place; Janet Shoe, FISH Food Pantry; Sherry Searles, Child Care & Early Learning Coalition; Susan Peebles, Somerset Redevelopment Group; Theresa Onderko, Education for Conflict Resolution; Cynthia Johnson, Learn More Center; Rachel Guyer, Little Friends Day Care; and Beverly Ferry, Living Well in Wabash County.

The final celebration night for this cohort culminated in Living Well of Wabash County winning \$12,000 worth of digital marketing support from Consumer51 to be used towards the development of a public transit bus route.



Entrepreneurship Advisory Committee

Grow Wabash County convened the high school Entrepreneurship Advisory Committee to coach and support local students along their paths to becoming entrepreneurs. This committee helped students prepare for the state's Innovate WithIN and local INnovate Wabash County shark-tank style business pitch competitions.

Innovate WithIN

The state's initiative, Innovate WithIN™, plays a key role in Indiana's entrepreneurial ecosystem by providing programming, pitching and pathways to nurture the next generation of innovators.



We were thrilled to see some of our local young entrepreneurs enjoy success in this competition. Seven Wabash County teams later advanced to regionals for this statewide competition. Of those teams that went to regionals, two from Wabash County advanced to be 2 of 11 teams that competed at the state final competition for Innovate WithIN. Although our two teams that competed at state, Millie & Mabel and Student Services, did not place in the top four for the state's competition, we were thrilled with their results and business development successes.

INnovate Wabash County



Grow Wabash County organized and hosted INnovate Wabash County, the inaugural local high school business pitch competition at the Honeywell Center's Ford Theater on April 16, 2019. At this competition, 35 students participated and 4 of the top groups received scholarships to lvy Tech, cash prizes, and a *Business in a Box*, which awarded them up to \$3000 for business support. All

participants received scholarships to Manchester University.

Judges for this competition included: Keith Gillenwater, Grow Wabash County; Steve Franks, Entrepreneur Coach and Arts Enthusiast; John Hoffman, SCORE Advisor and Experienced Small Business Owner; Professor Joe Messer, Experienced Entrepreneur and Professor of Entrepreneurship at Manchester University; and Lisa Gilman, Local Entrepreneur and Owner of Redemption Development and Wabash Woollen Works. Emcee for this event was Peter Shepherd of INGUARD.





Focus to grow the population of Wabash County which includes initiatives for housing development, quality of place projects, and community engagement.



Livability

As rural areas like Wabash County face the impact of declining population, special attention is being paid to quality of place and livability initiatives that encourage newcomer attraction and retention.

Housing Committee

Grow Wabash County convenes and participates in the City of Wabash Housing Committee. Over the last two years, we have been hard at work focusing on remediating several sites for housing in Wabash County. After undertaking a comprehensive housing study for the City of Wabash, we identified several sites for redevelopment in the City of Wabash and have taken steps to utilize those sites for residential use. We are partnering on the redevelopment of the Parkview Wabash Hospital legacy site, and are looking towards eventually developing the former GDX site and sites adjacent to downtown Wabash.

We were thrilled to participate in the groundbreaking for the new Chester Heights subdivision in North Manchester. Grow Wabash County and our legacy organization, the Economic Development Group of Wabash County, participated with the town of North Manchester back in 2015 in discussions on the potential acquisition of the ground that would later be developed into the new site and the subsequent negotiations that led to the new subdivision.

IMAGINE Wabash County

IMAGINE Wabash County is the joint effort between Grow Wabash County and the Community Foundation of Wabash County to study and address population migration and the loss of residents in Wabash County. Grow Wabash County believes that the biggest threat to the future of our community is the loss of population. In early 2019, Patty Grant, Executive Director of the Community Foundation of Wabash County (and the Chair of the 2020 Grow Wabash County Board of Directors), approached Grow Wabash County asking for our opinion regarding the largest threat facing Wabash County – with the added point that there was an opportunity to partner with the Lilly Endowment on the Gift VII initiative.


From this conversation, we commissioned the first comprehensive population study of Wabash County. Working with our consultants at the Community Research Institute from Purdue University Fort Wayne, Mark Becker of Becker Consulting, John Stafford of Make No Small Plans, and Amanda Lopez of Transform Consulting Group, we examined the historical data of where Wabash County has come from, looked at data that demonstrated what is currently happening in regards to population loss, and reviewed projections as to what the US Census Bureau and others are projecting our population will trend over the next 30 years.

Our study also included interviews with key individuals with local knowledge of major events over the previous several generations, and several focus groups composed of various demographic groups including millennials who moved back to Wabash County after leaving, millennials who moved away from Wabash County and did not plan to come back, individuals who work in Wabash County but

choose not to live here, and people who are not from Wabash County, but have chosen to relocate to the community, amongst others.

Based on the qualitative and quantitative data compiled, our study suggested a series of proposals we could undertake to help arrest and reverse the decline we are experiencing. Throughout the rest of 2019, our two organizations held three public meetings to discuss the results of our findings. Then representatives from both organizations attended as many public meetings as were able to discuss our study, meeting with everyone from fraternal organizations to city and town council meetings to school boards and service groups.

Looking ahead to 2020, we are working on implementing our study findings, focusing on developing one comprehensive plan in conjunction with all of our municipalities and will work to implement others focused specifically on our economic development strategies and efforts.





Ensure the availability of a high quality, trained workforce for Wabash County employers by coordinating training opportunities, talent attraction, retention, and development.



Workforce Development

We work every day to ensure the availability of a high-quality, trained workforce for Wabash County employers by coordinating training opportunities, talent attraction, retention and development.

Skills training opportunities

Throughout 2019, Grow Wabash County has focused on workforce development for all ages in Wabash County. Cultivating talent is a multi-tier approach that requires developing relations with youth early on and continuing that access to training all the way up to the seasoned employees upskilling for the next level of cutting-edge technology to remain competitive in their field.


We partner with our local high schools and higher education institutions to bridge the gap between employer needs and educational objectives. In today's low unemployment environment, we have focused heavily on attracting talent to our local employers. For instance, we have further developed our partnership with Heartland Career Center (HCC), a cooperative technical school that provides skills training to students from nine surrounding high schools. This collaboration has allowed us to connect employers, current and future, with the next generation of workers.

Our team at Grow Wabash County partnered with HCC in several areas in 2019 including: helping to establish a Heavy Duty Equipment Operator CDL program, creating support letters, connecting employers to internship and talent opportunities, helped execute the Interactive Career Expo, as well as helping with grant initiatives.

Early Childhood Education

Grow Wabash County is proud to be a community partner in the First Five Wabash County initiative. The vision of First Five of Wabash County is to support and revitalize our communities' early education efforts so that we can thrive long-term.

Our goals are to increase the capacity of our local high-quality early learning centers, increase the accessibility of our centers to families of all means, improve the quality of our offerings, increase the





First Five Wabash County participated in the annual Early Learning Summit for Economic Development held in Fort Wayne in 2019, and our President & CEO Keith Gillenwater participated as a speaker on a panel to discuss the need for increased attention to high-quality early childhood education and to illustrate how this is truly an economic development issue in Indiana.

We were also honored to celebrate the Community Foundation of Wabash County's own Julie Garber, who was voted by her peers as the 2019 Early Learning Champion for the State of Indiana.

Leadership Development & NXTGEN Leadership

Leadership Development Wabash County remains one of the flagship programs of Grow Wabash County. Our partnership with Manchester University, our many employers, and facilitator Jim Smith has turned our leadership development program into one of the premier leadership development programs in Indiana, and a program that we can be proud of.

Our 2018/19 class graduated 28 leaders in May, and the group projects they undertook – a new hoopstyle greenhouse at New Beginnings, a book program at our elementary schools and a youth career readiness program in conjunction with the Community Foundation of Wabash County fill gaps that are very much needed in our community. We launched our 2019/20 class in October with 28 additional students that are in the midst of their instruction as of the start of the new year.

We are very thankful to our many sponsors for our Leadership Development program, including the City of Wabash, Wabash County Commissioners, the town of North Manchester, the Community Foundation of Wabash County, Beacon Credit Union, NIPSCO, Duke Energy, Midwest Eye Consultants, Real Alloy, MRF Real Estate, Midwest Poultry and Timbercrest Senior Living.

We also worked with our local high school superintendents and principals to launch our first ever cohort of the NXTGEN Leadership program. This program was aimed at high school sophomores and was designed to present an age-appropriate version of our adult leadership program over the course of the fall semester to students representing each of our four high schools. We will be refining the program over the course of the spring and summer of 2020, compiling our lessons learned and using them to propel us forward into launching a retooled version of the NXTGEN program in the fall of 2020!



Young Professionals of Wabash County

As we look to the future, developing existing talent and attracting new talent is our top priority in an effort to fill the open positions at our local employers. The Young Professionals of Wabash County (YPWC) was formed in the fall of 2018 as a group to help young professionals excel in their careers by establishing a thriving network of peers and community-driven individuals within Wabash County.

This member-driven group's mission is to create a supportive professional network of dynamic relationships that thrive together in Wabash County through networking, philanthropy, and educational and community events. This group is free to join thanks to the resources provided by Grow Wabash County and the volunteer steering committee.

At the end of 2019, there were 185 young adults that receive updates via monthly email blasts and follow the group on social media. The goal with this group is to get the next generation of leaders more connected and involved, allowing for our young professionals to lay down roots and make this place their permanent home. This deeper connection can help employers with recruiting and ultimately help retain their talent. Young professionals are the future of Wabash County and this group gives them an opportunity to have a voice in Wabash County and grow into roles as leaders of our communities.

Business Development Pillar

As the definition of economic development evolves, we still maintain some of the traditional roles a local economic development organization holds, including traditional business recruitment and attraction strategies to diversify our economic landscape and provide new employment opportunities.

Sister Cities & International Relationships

Building upon our efforts that culminated in our first trip to Asia in late 2018, we continued to expand those efforts to establish our first international sister city in 2019. At the beginning of 2019, we had a lot of work to follow-up on following our return from Asia after laying the groundwork to establish our sister city relationship with Linhai City, China and foster a deeper connection with the leadership of Oji Interpack, the parent company of Oji Intertech in North Manchester.



Our efforts spanned beyond traditional economic development and has since included strategies to establish educational and arts/culture partnerships between us and our partners in Japan and China. These efforts paid dividends in 2019 and are predicted to continue to demonstrate their value moving forward.

Grow Wabash County is leading the economic development aspect of our international relationship-building plans. We sent follow-ups to approximately 30 companies that we met with in China in late 2018, as well as with all of

the companies that we met during our visit to Japan.

Wabash City Schools has since established its first international student exchange, welcoming high school students from Yamate Gakuin High School in Yokohama, Japan in the spring, and at the end of the summer, Wabash will play host to a large group of middle school students from Huangyuan Middle School in Hangzhou, China. Both schools are ones we visited in late 2018.

The Honeywell Foundation has also led a follow-up mission to China in late 2019, including a stay in Linhai City, and Superintendent Callahan flew over to meet the group in Linhai City as well to meet with additional schools interested in forging a new relationship with us. 2019 also saw us hosting a Japanese prospect whom we met in Japan in Wabash for an evening, and honoring Oji Intertech at our Annual Dinner Celebration in October 2019.

We are confident that our collective efforts will pay dividends for our citizens and our community for years to come.



Site Selection Attraction

Even as the definition of "economic development" continues to evolve, business attraction and our traditional efforts to market to site selection consultants remain a priority for Grow Wabash County.

In 2019, we represented Wabash County and Northeast Indiana during an Indiana Power Partnership trip to visit with site selection consultants based in Atlanta & Greenville, SC. Over the course of this two-day trip, we met with fifteen different consultants and were given a chance to sell our communities and region's assets for business investment opportunities.

Wabash Mayor Scott Long, along with Keith Gillenwater, attended the International Council of Shopping Centers RECon conference in Las Vegas where we spent another two full days meeting with national brands and franchises in order to pitch the City of Wabash and Wabash County as a destination for new retail development opportunities.

We also hosted consultants for two site visits in North Manchester as part of the Duke Site Readiness program, and visited with a dozen other consultants at the Economix leadership conference in Charleston late in 2019. Throughout the year, we stay in regular contact with consultants to let them know about our wins, as sites and buildings come up for sale, and to let them know about all of the great things happening in Wabash County.

Brownfield Remediation

One commonly overlooked program that Grow Wabash County often participates in is the remediation of brownfield sites, or sites that may have an actual or perceived environmental risk, in our community.

Over the years, we've had a role either directly on behalf of Grow Wabash County (or our legacy organizations) or through our fee-for-service contract with the City of Wabash, and have worked on projects such as the remediation of the former Brown Trucking sites. Over the last few years we have been working with the City of Wabash to start the remediation of the Sposeep properties, and in 2019 we formally kicked off a project to ultimately re-mediate the former GDX site.

As with all of our projects, this would not be possible without the support and leadership of our partners on these projects. We tip our hat to Mayor Scott Long and the Common Council for the City of Wabash for having the vision to tackle these challenging sites to bring them back onto the tax roles and contributing to the growth of our community.
